We are hoping to arrange a couple of 'Summer walks' during June and July and then evening talks in the hall from September onwards.



"Original Sources" The world's greatest minds as recorded in their own words and first hand accounts.

Just visit the Essex County Council's website, click on Libraries, then click on 'online access', then click on 'Connect' for the site of your choice, type in your ELAN Readers' Card number (without any spaces) add your pass word (which is normally the last part of your postcode that you now use to obtain your library books) and bingo, the world of facts an figures is at your fingertips.

Essex County Council are Corporate Subscribers to this service which means that everyone in Essex can access the material completely free of charge. (as part of our Council Tax)

A GROUP PROJECT FOR THE COMING YEAR

As well as the individual research that members are currently doing it was felt that the group as a whole could also work on a joint, corporate project to create something worthwhile for the Lexden village of the future.

Several suggestions were discussed and finally we chose "Lexden in Wartime" as a suitable subject to study, given that wartime memories are fast fading out of existence and will soon be lost forever, along with documentation, pictures, recollections etc.

If you have any memories or research about the Home Guard, firewatching, pillboxes, rationing,

street parties, evacuees, etc. please write it down for posterity.

Members may safely deposit material with the archive and it is hoped to produce a booklet at the end of the session so that a written record of life in Lexden at that time can be left on file for future generations.

There's no rush., we have all year to collate and write up the material and at the end of the year we can have something to be proud of that we can leave for others to study.



TRAGIC ACCIDENT TO LEXDEN PARK SERVANT

A sad and fatal accident occurred in October 1831 to Robert Hewitt, a servant to Mr J F Mills of Lexden Park.

Mr Mills' carriage was returning from Copford in the evening, when Robert Hewitt, who was sitting behind, suddenly had a fit and fell upon the wheel.

He remained there until the carriage reached Lexden Park, where he was found lodged on the wheel. He was severely injured by the wheel which had literally ground away a large portion of the shoulder, separating the arteries.


The blood which flowed from the wound was traced back nearly two and a half miles.

He lingered with little pain, until he died. He had no recollection of what had happened, except that he remembered his hat falling off. His hat was found near Mr.Ambrose's house at Copford. Robert Hewitt left a wife and six children.

He was buried in Lexden churchyard along with two other of Mr Mill's servants who died in three consecutive years. Mr Mills had the headstones made (pictured below) as a memorial to his three faithful servants.
